Subj: Most Effective Democratic (and Republican) Messaging on Tariffs

Prior to and following Donald Trump's "Liberation Day" announcement enacting tariffs on all other countries, we tested 43 individual messages on tariffs — including from elected Democrats, elected Republicans, and other stakeholders. These findings are based on surveys of more than 26,287 Americans over March 31 through today.

<u>Learnings from the most effective Democratic messages:</u>

- Tariffs are a hidden tax for the middle class. Be specific about what prices are about to be higher.
- Tariffs are part of Trump's larger economic pattern: tax breaks for the rich, tax hikes for the rest. Messages that performed well connected this tax hike for middle class families to Trump's tax cuts for working people.
- Remind Americans about how tariffs are rising prices while their earned benefits
 (Social Security, Medicaid, and Medicare) are on the chopping block. The
 top-performing message of all ones we tested (which ranks in the 100th percentile a
 whopper of a message!) combines tariffs with attacks on Trump's budget cuts to Social
 Security, Medicare, and Medicaid.

Learnings from less effective Democratic messaging:

- Focus on costs over the stock market: Though messages that include the volatility in
 the stock market are not ineffective, messages that focus on the stock market and the
 risk of a recession were less effective than those focused on consumer costs. While the
 stock market may be dominating the news, the supermarket continues to be what
 matters to voters.
- Avoid overly abstract or policy heavy appeals: Messages that are too removed from people's everyday experiences and emphasized trade wars, international relationships, or economic theory.
- Avoid insulting or absurdity: The worst-performing messages used mockery, sarcasm, or melodramatic language. We recommend avoiding messages that lean too far into disdain for Trump, which mirrors previous findings that Americans think Democrats are too focused on knee-jerk opposition to Trump, regardless of the content.

Percentile ranking is relative to 260 messages since Inauguration Day tested on a variety of topics, like inflation, abortion, the economy, and more. The higher the percentile, the more effective that talking point is at persuading a voter to vote for Democrats in 2026 compared to

other Democratic messages we've tested. <u>We recommend utilizing above-average talking points, i.e. those above the 50th percentile.</u>

| Accountable US | Trump and Musk's economic policies are already devastating families' pocketbooks. | Job Losses in Manufacturing | Donald Trump's tariffs on imported materials like steel and aluminum increase production costs for U.S. manufacturers, potentially leading to job losses and factory closures. 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| Rep. Del Bene | Trump and Republicans promised to lower prices but they're making cars and many other goods more expensive with their tariffs.
